About the Program:



- Our objective is to work closely with you and your students to develop a composition that authentically reflects your unique school community. This program is an extension of our Mural program at the Museum and will connect students with a talented muralist teaching artist who will serve as a creative mentor.
- The artist will introduce your students to their artistic practice and the history of murals. They will then collaborate with your students to conceptualize the mural, guide students through the design process, and collectively execute its creation (~4-6 weeks in total).
- It is our mission that your mural will "speak" in words and visual imagery about the
 identities, stories, and lived experiences of your students using striking images and
 bilingual messaging. Through El Mero Muro: Murals in School, students will gain
 knowledge of the historical significance of muralism through art history while developing
 valuable skills through the diverse stages of the project.
- This program concludes with an opening reception for the mural, a celebration where students and teaching artists are recognized for their work. We will invite the community and city officials to be part of the reception as well.
