Cinco de Mayo is the date of May 5, 1862 that commemorates a Mexican victory at Puebla over the invading French troops. Civilians and soldiers alike joined General Ignacio Zaragosa to push back the French army. This single battle was one of the most glorious victories in Mexican history. The French later won the war and France instated Archduke Ferdinand Maximilian of Austria as Mexico's emperor. In 1867, Benito Juarez seized control of the Mexican government once more. It is fitting that all Texans pay tribute to General Zaragoza because he was a Texan, born in the Presidio in Goliad, Texas in 1829. In Austin, as early as 1886, Lino Torres and Emile Tarratas planned a Cinco de Mayo celebration in downtown at what is now known as Republic Square.




